



FileMaker Pro 13 and FileMaker Pro 13 Advanced v3 Updater Release Notes

Software Description

This software updates FileMaker Pro 13 or FileMaker Pro 13 Advanced to version 13.0v3.

Updater Details

FileMaker Pro 13.0v3 includes OpenSSL 1.0.1g, which is not vulnerable to the Heartbleed bug. In addition, the TLS heartbeat in OpenSSL is disabled, which removes the attack method used by the Heartbleed bug.

Who Should Install This Software?

Install this software if you are using any of the configurations listed below. Please verify that you are using the appropriate updater for your product.

Notes

- After downloading and applying the FileMaker Pro 13.0v3 or FileMaker Pro 13.0v3 Advanced updater program on OS X, you must restart your machine before using the software.
- It is possible that FileMaker passwords may become compromised due to a Heartbleed bug exploit. We recommend that you change all passwords after updating your software.

Installation Instructions

To ensure a smooth installation, disable virus detection software before applying the update, and re-enable it after the installation is complete.

This update will require approximately 1.8 GB of free space on your hard disk.

1. Quit FileMaker Pro 13 or FileMaker Pro 13 Advanced. Other applications can remain open.
2. Double-click the appropriate FileMaker Pro or FileMaker Pro Advanced 13.0v3 updater program for the platform and product you are using.
3. Read and accept the displayed license agreement, then proceed as directed.
4. Click **Update** to update your software. After the update has completed, you will see a message confirming the successful installation of the new version.

OS X: If you have more than one copy of FileMaker Pro 13 or FileMaker Pro 13 Advanced installed on your system, you will be prompted to select one of each product you want to update. You are required to update all FileMaker Pro 13 products. You cannot update a single product.

5. Quit the updater and open the new version of FileMaker Pro or FileMaker Pro Advanced to verify that the update was successful.

OS X: The version information may not be updated until the next time you log in or restart.

If the update does not complete successfully, try the following:

Windows:

1. Create backup copies of any files you saved in the FileMaker Pro 13 or FileMaker Pro 13 Advanced application folder.
2. Use the Programs and Features control panel to remove FileMaker Pro 13 or FileMaker Pro 13 Advanced.
3. Install FileMaker Pro or FileMaker Pro Advanced version 13.0v1 using your original installation program.
4. Run the updater program again.

OS X:

1. Create backup copies of any files you saved in the FileMaker Pro 13 or FileMaker Pro 13 Advanced application folder.
2. Remove FileMaker Pro 13 or FileMaker Pro 13 Advanced.
3. Install FileMaker Pro or FileMaker Pro Advanced version 13.0v1 using your original installation program.
4. Run the updater program again.

If, after following the steps above, you are still unable to successfully update to FileMaker Pro or FileMaker Pro Advanced 13.0v3, contact WinSoft Customer Support for assistance: <http://support.winsoft-international.com/>.

- Support for inserting QuickTime media file types into container fields using the “Insert QuickTime” command will be deprecated. (“Insert Audio/Video,” its replacement, which was introduced in FileMaker Pro 12, will still be supported.)
- Windows: Support for QuickTime on Windows will be deprecated.
- OS X: Support for Bento data will be deprecated. To assist you with migrating Bento data to FileMaker Pro, you can use the Bento 4 to FileMaker Pro Migration Tool. For more information, visit <http://help.filemaker.com>.
- OS X: Support for playing back recorded sounds that were recorded using the “Insert Sound” command will be deprecated.
